The work involves the demolition of two vacant care homes, which is being undertaken by others under a separate contract, to clear the way for our construction works to commence on site on 08 September 2025, to create a brand-new 66-bed care home. The new care home will feature all en-suite bedrooms and a range of high-quality amenities, including a café, library and cinema and is due to be completed early 2027.
